WHAT IS FENTANYL

Fentanyl is a synthetic opioid used for pain management similar to Oxycodone, Percocet, and Demerol.

Two types of Fentanyl:

Medical Grade Fentanyl



Illicit Fentanyl







Fentanyl is approximately **50 times** more potent than heroin and produces more immediate yet shorter lasting effects.

When opioid receptors are activated in our nervous system, our breathing slows. With opioids as intense as fentanyl, it doesn't often take much to slow our breathing to dangerously low rates or to cease breathing entirely.




These influences have contributed to a drug market where individuals are:

- lacking awareness of fentanyl in their substances
- have an inability to distinguish which substances do or don't contain fentanyl
- or have a lack of alternatives that don't contain fentanyl at all

10,000,000+ Americans use illicit opioids each year.

As a result, % of the over 100,000 overdose deaths annually in the United States involve a synthetic opioid.









WHERE IS FENTANYL FOUND?

Fentanyl is most often found in, and sold in, three forms:



Powder that can resemble or be mixed into other drugs like cocaine



Mixed into
crystalline drugs
such as
methamphetamine



Pill form that can resemble prescription drugs and other illicit or counterfeit pills *

Fentanyl can be found in other substances such as heroin, methamphetamine, cocaine, MDMA, and counterfeit pills that might resemble Xanax or Valium.
